


For several years now the students have made an annual trip to an even more remote village several hours away. They spend a week there and hold VBS and do educational seminars and teach and preach Bible. We give school supplies to the children and over all provide a great blessing to the community. They all love us and we love all of them. Here are some pics of the supplies we will provide this trip which will be the third week in May. These represent a supply for 600 children. Lots of kids, lots of stuff, lots of work, lots of money and tons of blessings. One pic shows the gift for just one kinder kid. Some of these kids have never had a new pencil. There are souls saved and much gospel preached every year.

We certainly qualify to be included in the verse above in all categories. Someone wise once said, "When God closes one door He opens another." I have seen that played out over and over in the life of my ministry. Even now, no doubt in my final ministry this side of heaven, the good Lord has allowed several ministerial doors to close but has also opened others. We ministered in the prison just a half mile from our compound for nearly 7 years...then covid. After 14 months I asked when we might get back in. The answer was when all the prisoners (3000) get vaccinated and as of now, the government has not begun to schedule that. I'm sure when they all get that then they will require that the ministers be all vaccinated. So, it is unlikely we will see the inside of the prison any time soon. The same scenario applies to the several public schools we have been in and the boy's town, girl's town, nursing home, etc etc.

Those doors are closed, but look; many new doors are opening. The institute students and grads on our property have searched out and found several remote, indigenous villages that allow us to come in and minister freely. Many of them are within 40 minutes away. Since we spend that much time traveling to street ministries in the city we now mix it up and do both. Here is a photo of our first official publick ministry in a village named Talakag. Nice, clean, busy, little community with, at least, novel interest.
