We have a skilled interpreter in our ministry here and some that are learning. They are pleasant folk, but to minister to them is a real challenge. Most of them are quite uneducated here in the PI so they lack general knowledge of life. Also, not only must all things be interpreted...they don't read English...or Cebuano so...a Bible is little help. I noticed last night the deaf reading the song words projected on the wall and signing accordingly but I was told they know a few English words but not enough to truly read. Add to this their lack of ability to express emotion and to understand obscure phrases and emotions in the Bible. In this photo Brenton White is preaching in English, our deaf interpreter is translating, a deaf person is listening, and I am entertained...a different angle to publick ministry.
